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FROM THE PASTOR

**“I will pour out my spirit on all flesh;
your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,
your old men shall dream dreams,
and your young men shall see visions.” Joel 2:28**

I have so enjoyed my time with many of you on Sunday mornings in worship. For me, worship is the central act of the congregation in which we praise God, confess our sins, hear the Word sung and proclaimed, participate in the sacraments and pass the peace of Christ. This time in the sanctuary with God and each other prepares us for the week ahead in a way that nothing else can.

On June 12, we will celebrate Pentecost, which many consider to be the “birthday” of the church. It is the time when the Holy Spirit was poured out on all the believers and they were able to speak of God to their friends and neighbors, as well as those visiting Jerusalem from afar. I hope you will come to worship wearing red that day as a symbol of the “tongues of fire” in the Pentecost story. We will share in cake afterwards, the most important part of any birthday party!

God’s Spirit has been likened to a Wind, which blows where it will, and as mentioned in the above text from Joel, can manifest itself in surprising places! No one can predict how exactly the Spirit will be at work, but dreams and visions are always a good sign. I have been inspired to be a part of New Beginnings groups where I listen to mature men and women dream big dreams which often are not focused on their own needs or desires. For instance, why would a senior citizen care about Heritage having a good youth ministry? Why would an older woman care that we provide opportunities for children to sing? These are dreams of the Spirit, given not just to sustain the institution called church, but to be faithful to our call to reach out to a world in need. Young people too, dreaming what God could do here; and speaking their opinions.

We can make our plans, and assess ourselves for how we are doing, but we cannot control what the Holy Spirit of God will do in this place. Let’s pray that the Spirit will raise up men and women of faith to dream big dreams, to pursue their faith with passion and to reach out with the love of Christ. Then our heritage will not be only what we have done in the past, but how we partner with the work of God in the future.

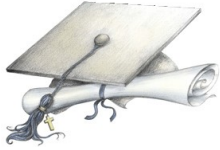

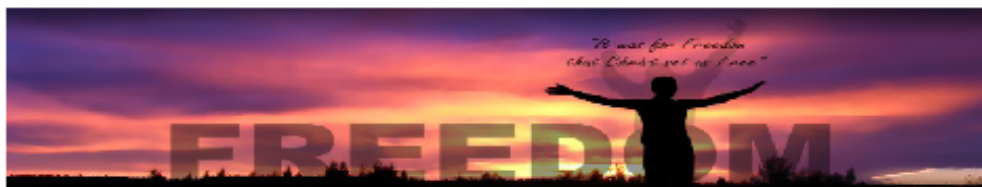

FOOD FOR YOUR BODY



Beef Stroganoff

1 pound of Sirloin beef sliced 1/2 inch thick squares

(Cut out fat)

1/4 pound of butter

1 cup of mushrooms

1/2 cup of chopped onions

1 can condensed beef broth

1 cup of sour cream

2 1/2 tablespoons of white flour

1/2 teaspoon of salt, pepper to taste

1. Brown meat quickly in skillet
2. Push to one side.
3. Add mushrooms and onions.
4. Sauté without browning onions.
5. Add broth and heat to boiling.
6. Blend sour cream and flour.
7. Stir into broth.
8. Cook stirring until mixture thickens.
9. Add salt and pepper. Sauce will be thin.
10. Serve over long stem and wild rice.

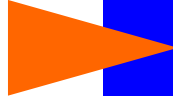

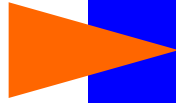
