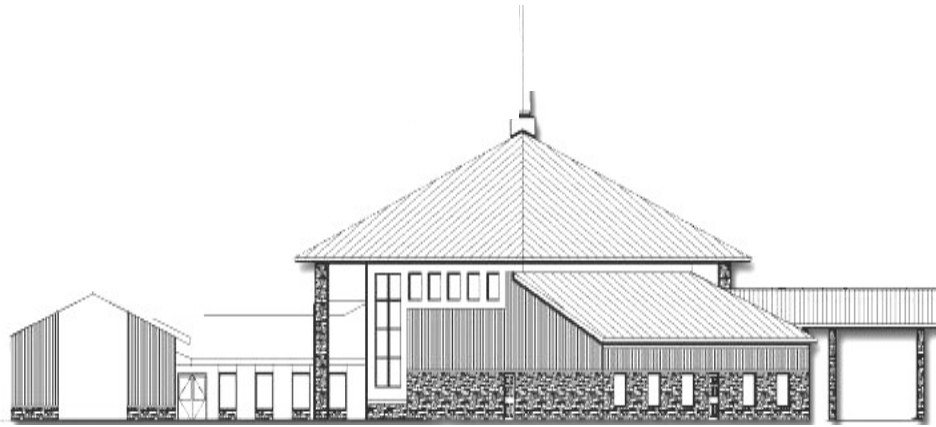

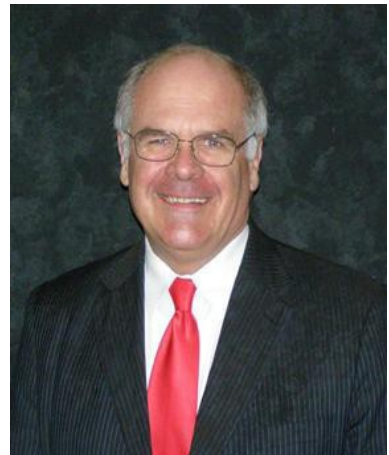

The Angel, the Cross, and the Display Case



Around October of 2008, Metta Martin came up to me and stated that she had two carvings that she had created out of wood, a Cross and an Angel, that she wanted to donate to the church. She was asking the Men's Club to find a suitable place to display them.

The Men's Club discussed several ways, including buying one or building one, to obtain a display case. Around April of 2009 I went on-line and searched for display and trophy cases but was unhappy with all that I saw.

I took the dimensions from one of them and drew up some plans so one could be built from wood; however, I never showed the plans because, again, I just didn't feel right about them.

About the middle of June, I remembered a friend who had a shop that manufactured beautiful display cases for stores, some of which sold high priced crystal. These cabinets were usually made of steel and had glass sides, mirror backs and bottoms, and were lit with small LED, Fiber Optic or Halogen lights that could be aimed within the cabinet. The name of the company is Active Metal, Inc., of 2219 Cottage Street, Ashland, OH 44805. I called and asked if I could visit. While there, I asked if they had any used, demo, scratch or dented cases that they would like to sell to the church at a discount. We discussed the appropriate size and a few other specifications, and Sam Kline, the president of the company, said that they could do something for us.

On August 25, Sam called and asked if they could deliver the cabinet the next day. I was there to accept the delivery early Wednesday. It was beautiful. It was a brand new display case and had the latest in Halogen lighting.

I called Sam to thank him and told him that I had received everything but the invoice. He told me that he and his employees, many of whom are family, were discussing the price. One of his brothers reminded him that their parents had visited Heritage Presbyterian Church several times over a two to three year period and really liked the church, but it was too far for them at their advanced age to attend regularly. Their parents talked highly of the church and the warm reception that they had received here. Because of that, they wanted to donate the display case to Heritage in the names of their parents, Dean and Lucille Kline.

During the worship service on Sunday, September 13, we received the Angel and the Cross from Metta, and we dedicated them and the display case to be used for the will of God!

We would like to thank Metta Martin for her inspiring carvings. Also, Active Metal, Inc., and the Kline family for the beautiful display case. They both look great in the hallway of the church.

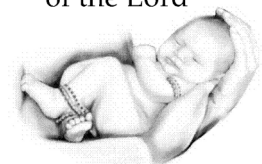
