# FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

**E**arlier this summer our Christian Education Team and our Program Coordinating Team sent a questionnaire to members of the congregation and gained very helpful information. Over 40 individuals responded and indicated that learning about our faith is very important. A large percentage of people also supported making a few changes, in time, to help our Sunday morning run smoothly for Choir Rehearsal, Christian Education and Worship.

Starting Sunday, October 4<sup>th</sup>

Pre-Worship Activities start at 9:00am (Choir Practice, Bell Choir, Church related meetings, etc.)

Opportunities to Discover and Learn start at 10:00am for all ages

Worship and Children's Church start at 11:00am

These time changes make it possible;

- For all age groups to participate in Christian Education classes at the same time, making it possible for young couples to bring their children to Sunday School and simultaneously participate in Adult Education programs.
- Individuals involved in pre-worship activities (like Choir) can now participate in the entire Christian Education class.
- The minister of music now has more time for pre worship rehearsal with choral and instrumental groups.

After "Time for Young Church" during corporate worship families may choose to send their youngsters to "Children's Church" held in Heritage Hall. This program will use activity and learning centers designed to provide a positive worship experience while allowing children to be children.

October 4th is the beginning of our Tenth Anniversary Celebration. I join the rest of the leadership of Heritage Presbyterian Church to invite you to "Join the Adventure and Grow With Us Into God's Future!" We are expanding our Sunday Morning schedule for an expanded decade. Help us celebrate our Tenth Anniversary. Dear Members and Friends

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

*New Consecration Sunday* is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.


Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.



Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday events.



# MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

## The Blue Beads

In December, 1928, I was six, almost seven, in the second grade at Brownhelm School. It was the last day of school before Christmas vacation. We'd had a party with a gift exchange and cupcakes and singing. We were putting on our coats and boots to go home, when Tommy Sharpe, a classmate, handed me a present. "Merry Christmas, Cathryn," he said, shyly.

On the way home on the bus I opened it. The most beautiful blue beads! The very most beautiful! I showed them to my friend, Mabel, carefully, I thought, but the string broke and the lovely beads fell to the floor.

The floor on the bus was wood, with big cracks. (The bus had a motor, but just two years earlier, buses had been powered by horses. "Kid wagons," they were called.) My beautiful azure beads rolled into the cracks and were gone. I didn't get to show them to my mother or even wear them. Worse than that, during the two-week vacation, Tommy Sharpe and his family moved. I never saw him again. I don't remember what he looked like, not at all, but I remember the beads and how happy I was to be given an unexpected present. (They were probably glass, Ben Franklin store's finest.)

Two generations later, a few days before Christmas, I was telling this story to my granddaughter, Sarah, who was seven. She was right with me, living it. "You never saw Tommy again?" she asked, almost crying. "No," I replied. "Years later I knew some people named Sharpe but nobody knew a Thomas Sharpe.

Sarah jumped up, and ran downstairs to find her mother. Excitedly, she said, non-stop, "We have to get Grandma some blue beads for Christmas because hers got lost in the cracks and Tommy moved and she never saw him again and she doesn't have any blue beads!"

Her mother, like Tommy's, knew exactly what to do. She even had a box. I have blue beads. They're not as beautiful as Tommy's, but they remind me of his long ago perfect gift.

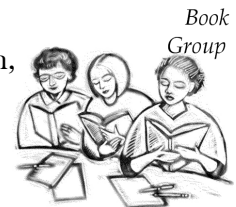

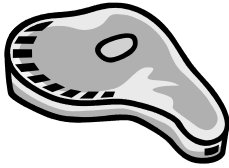

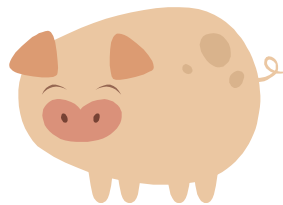
